**PROPOSITONS**

<b>PROP 30</b>	<b>YES</b>	This measure is worth billions to California's underfunded schools, and is backed by teachers unions, Democrats, and other people we trust. Of the two education props this year, this is the preferred option.

<b>PROP 35</b>	<b>YES</b>	On top of increased prison terms, this measure would require all registered sex offenders to disclose their internet accounts, and institute criminal fines for convicted human traffickers to pay for services to help victims.
<b>PROP 36</b>	<b>YES</b>	Prop 36 will restore the original intent of the three strikes law by giving repeat offenders of non-violent crime double the ordinary sentence instead of sentences up to life in prison.
<b>PROP 37</b>	<b>YES</b>	MMMM...those GMOs sure are delicious! But wait, are they delicious? To us food snobs it sounds like they may not be. Also, might they be killing everyone? Nobody knows, which seems like a good enough reason to vote for this measure, which would require the labeling of GMOs on our food.
